## **Mission Statement:**

Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat For Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities, and hope.

## **Mission Principles:**

### **1. Demonstrate the love of Jesus Christ.**

We undertake our work to demonstrate the love and teachings of Jesus, acting in all ways in accord with the belief that God's love and grace abound for all, and that we must be "hands and feet" of that love and grace in our world. We believe that, through faith, the miniscule can be multiplied to accomplish the magnificent and that, in faith, respectful relationships can grow among all people.

### **2. Focus on shelter.**

We have chosen, as our means of manifesting God's love, to create opportunities for all people to live in decent, durable shelter. We put faith into action by helping to build, renovate, or preserve homes, and by partnering with others to accelerate and broaden access to affordable housing as a foundation for breaking the cycle of poverty.

### **3. Advocate for affordable housing.**

In response to the prophet Micah's call to do justice, to love mercy and to walk humbly with God, we promote decent, affordable housing for all, and we support the global community's commitment to housing as a basic human right. We will advocate for a just and fair housing policy to eliminate the constraints that contribute to poverty housing. And, in all of our work, we will seek to put shelter on hearts and minds in such powerful ways that poverty housing becomes socially, politically, and religiously unacceptable.

### **4. Promote dignity and hope.**

We believe that no one lives in dignity until everyone can live in dignity. We believe that every person has something to contribute and something to gain from creating communities in which all people have decent, affordable places to live. We believe that dignity and hope are best achieved through equitable, accountable partnerships.

### **5. Support sustainable and transformational development.**

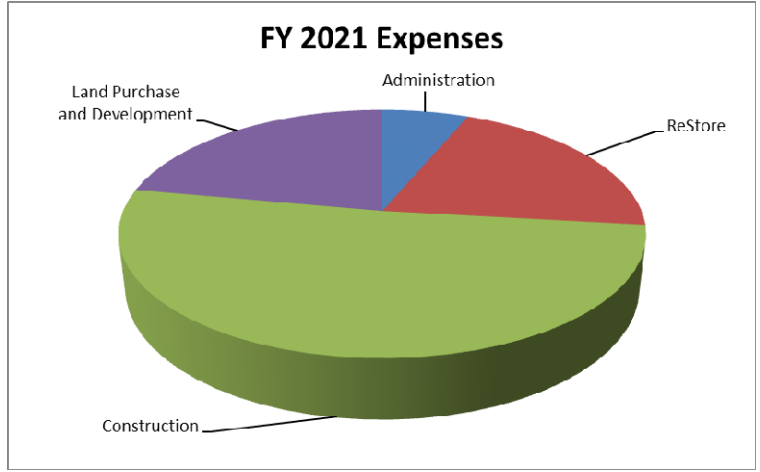
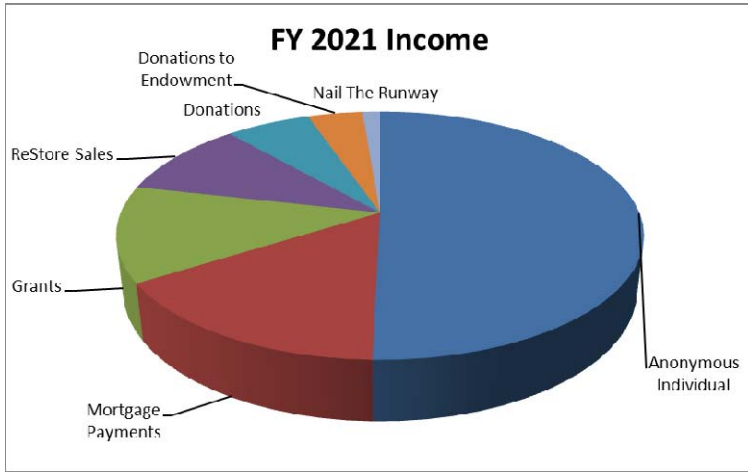

### From the President of the Board of Directors

If you asked these soon-to-be-homeowners where they see themselves in five years, they will no doubt break into a grin, talk about their families’ plans for the future, and ponder ways in which they can share their Habitat journeys with others who also need HOPE. Their passion and energy are inspirational, driving BAHFH staff and volunteers to strive for growth and innovation so that even more families can transform HOPE into reality.

Your gifts to Habitat - money, volunteer hours, prayers, or all three - will manifest themselves this coming year and in the next five years in ways only God knows today. But we do know that our potential for success – for offering HOPE – grows exponentially with every gift.

I pray God will reveal to me more ways I can add to the success of BAHFH through my gifts of time, talent, and treasure. ### From the Executive Director

It is in the coming together that our impact is amplified. A single nail isn’t much good when it comes to sheltering a family; when you put 12,000 of them together, a family has safe and durable shelter.

It works the same way with Habitat supporters. In our last fiscal year, 585 donors came together and donated over 1.5 million dollars. 307 volunteers came together and gave us over 12,000 hours of their time. I am so grateful for every dollar and every minute these generous people gave to the families Brookings Habitat serves.

It was a difficult year for so many, including us. We were greatly restricted in how and where we could use volunteers. We had staff working remotely and from home. In the chaos and uncertainty that we saw this last year, we never wavered from our mission; we never stopped building homes.

The uncertainty of this last year brought us new opportunities. Because we were unsure how long the public schools would be able to have in-person instruction, the Building Trades program came to our building site and, thankfully, worked all year toward making safe and durable shelter possible for a deserving family.

When it was safe to do so, our intrepid Foundation Crew returned to work Wednesdays and Thursdays. The steadfast application of their skills brought two homes over the finish line and two more significantly closer. Care-A-Vanners were able to travel again and three teams came to visit this summer, each putting in two solid weeks of hard work.

We spent more of our time responding to emergencies than I would have liked, but we also spent a great deal of time planning for our future. Our Board of Directors adopted a strategic plan that puts us on a path to more than double the number of families we serve each year by the end of 2026—just five short years.

With this roadmap in hand, we made critical investments. We sought and received a grant that made a new roof and other necessary repairs to our office possible. We created two staff positions. We paid down our debt and will burn the ReStore’s mortgage at our annual picnic next year. With good friends we partnered in the launch of a new Brookings subdivision – River Run.

We celebrated great success in the completion of two homes and four repair projects, and the receipt of our largest single gift. We accepted an additional challenge to raise \$500,000 in construction restricted dollars. When we meet that goal, \$250,000 more will be made available to us.

We do all of this because the need for decent and affordable shelter is dire and the benefits that come to a family that lives in a home that they own and can afford are great.

We need you more than ever. Please bring your family, friends, work group or volunteer committee to a jobsite and volunteer. Please consider making a construction restricted gift and help us meet our challenge. Please consider becoming a monthly donor. Please keep us in your daily prayers.

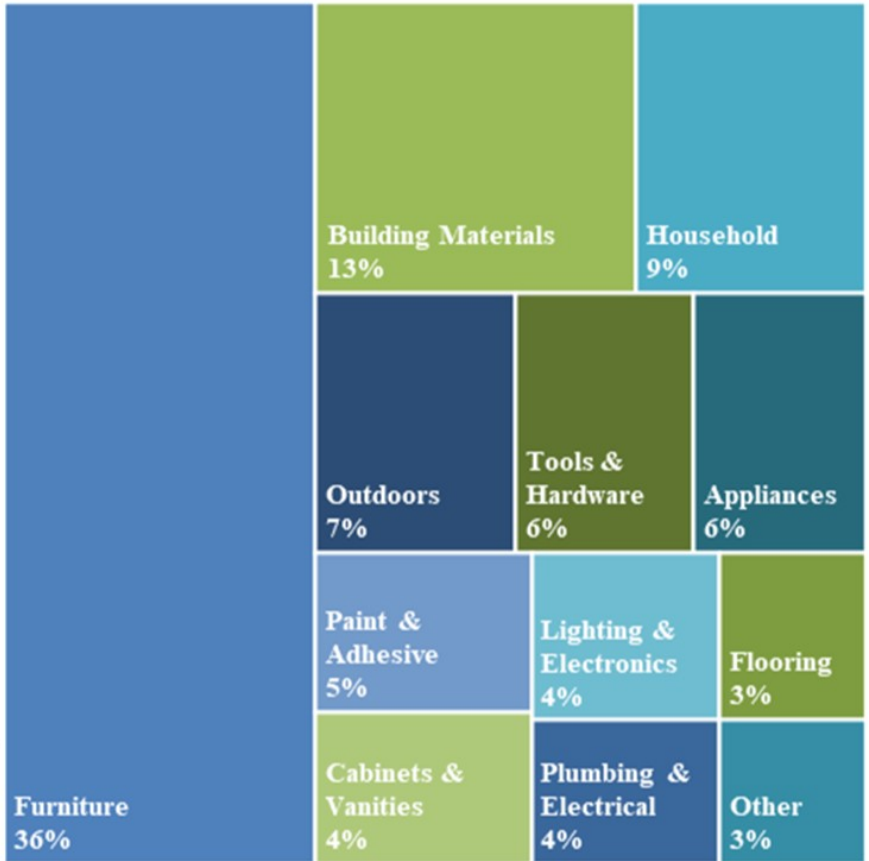


# FY 2020-2021 Annual Report

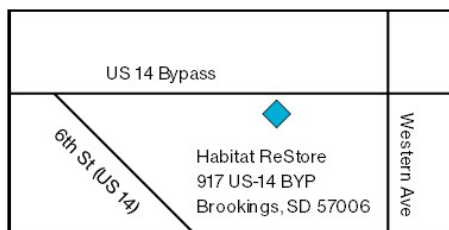

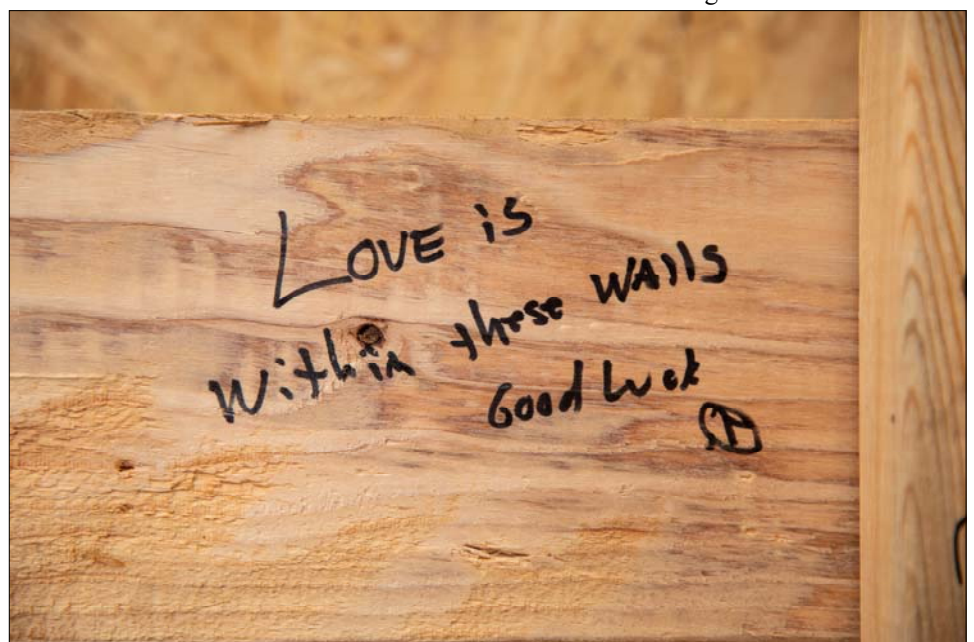
